IT'S BEEN 10 YEARS.AND WHAT A RIDE IT HAS BEEN!

At the end of December, Training Ground officially turned ten years old. My mind quickly races to thousands of stories of young men being challenged in their faith through this ministry. Since we started with four young men in our summer session of 2007, Training Ground has added numerous weekend destination trips that have afforded us the opportunity to be involved in the lives of hundreds of men. Also in these ten years, the ministry expanded to the first campus outside of Colorado. This past September, the gap year program in Sarasota, Florida began, being led by one of our valued alumni, Corey Woosley.

The original vision back in 2006 included multiple campuses, but we didn't know how to get there. It was in our hearts to create something that would change the lives of Christian young men causing them to know and love the Lord deeper. Both Xan and I had grown up in more traditional styles of discipleship, which we were extremely grateful for, but we needed more. It was our hope to disciple young men as well, but in a different way. We wanted to change the way people thought about discipleship for young men. Our desire was to supply them with the necessary tools to be successful, godly leaders in their communities, families and churches.

2016 has been a great year, maybe one of our finest. With our destination trips to Florida and North Carolina, our twelve-week summer program in Colorado Springs, our continued work with alumni, and the work in Sarasota, it has felt very successful. One thing that I continue to be struck with is this: What we do in the lives of young men works! Because God has equipped us, we are able to give them the necessary training to grow and mature in their faith through the context of life changing relationships.

Corey Woosley, our director in Sarasota FL, is good fruit of the ministry. I am so proud of what he has done in the last five years since his time with TG in Colorado Springs. He is now a married man, a leader in his community, and leading other young men to find their identity in Christ, largely due to the training he received. He has had some challenges, but seeing him love his wife well and lead young men brings a tear to my eye. If any of you travel through that area, you should grab coffee with him to hear his passion to see young men grow.

It is a good season to reflect on the last ten years and to dream about the next ten. Our hope is to continue training staff, and to start new campuses where young men will have the same opportunities to grow and be strengthened in their faith. This is most certainly a good time to reflect and be grateful for everything we've experienced, including the challenges. Without the pains of the first ten years, we never would have been prepared for the next ten. The lessons we have learned as a small non-profit have been invaluable in helping to create and build a ministry that allows us to see the desire of our hearts fulfilled. We are truly grateful.

FROM OUR BEGINNINGS TO TODAY -

In 2006, Cory Smith and Xan Hood desired to make a difference in the lives of college-age men and birthed the ministry of Training Ground. It was a huge risk. Ten years later Training Ground continues to impact men all over the country!

Training Ground has ministered to over 250 men through our intensive programs. These men have spent over 170,000 combined hours in solid biblical teaching and being mentored. This would be equal to one guy being taught for 40 hours a week for almost 82 years!

We love it and are privileged to be in the lives of these men. With every marriage the Training Ground Family expands exponentially. In one 18 month time period [2014-2015], eighteen of our alumni were married and eight alumni were engaged.

In the beginning, Training Ground focused only on the 3-month TG sessions. Today, we are no longer just a summer discipleship program but have added a 7 month Gap Year Program in Sarasota Florida. We have also become a ministry that impacts our local community through are involvement at nearby colleges, churches, and our growing community of volunteers.

As you look at the pie chart graphic you can see there are three major areas where we invest 90% our time.

DISCIPLESHIP PROGRAMS - 50%

Many of our supporters are familiar with the variety of amazing ways God works in our 3 month summer sessions and that in 2016 We added a 7 month gap year program.

Through the 3 pillars of valuing hard work, the importance of the wilderness adventure, and the necessity for worshiping our Creator, the young men are engaged holistically in their journeys as men. This process is an intense, purposeful, and multifaceted training that challenges them physically. emotionally, intellectually and spiritually.

During a typical week, a young man will work 40 hours, spend a day in nature fishing, listen to a guide talking about biblical interpretation, and participate in various topics from calling, finances, sexual addictions, caring for the heart of a women, or a man's story.

Out of the 2000 plus hours a young man spends in the TG program, he receives over 200 hours of individualized instruction. During this time, we also engage his story. Many of our guys may share of feeling entitled, wounded by abuse, passive from an overbearing parent, or feeling deep grief over the loss of a relationship.

As a community, we get to watch this beautiful process of brokenness, healing and restoration as God meets these young men in the most vulnerable parts of their hearts and stories. We are so grateful to be a part of what He is doing.

ALUMNI - 20%

When a young man participates and graduates the 3 month summer session, or the gap year program, it is just the beginning!

After the TG experience, our guys can participate in life-long discipleship with TG. The continuing contact with TG staff and the broader TG community offers them opportunities to sustain their maturity, growth and development. As a staff, we weekly make 20 - 30 contacts with our alumni. Simple text, phone calls, emails, social media, and face to face meetings all reinforce the valuable lessons of their Training Ground experience.

The TG staff invest 20% or more of our time intentionally in the lives of the men that have come through our program. Our alumni can also stay in contact on the private TG Brotherhood Facebook page.

LOCAL COMMUNITY - 20%

It may seem strange to talk so much about our Local Community but for us it makes complete sense. We could not accomplish this ministry to college-age men without the 125 plus men and women who come alongside our staff.

We believe that everyone has something to offer and that involvement facilities a broader community.

Our invitation to our guides and volunteers is to be who they are and offer what God has taught them.

Throughout our programs, we see older men walking in their own stories and offering the good, the bad and the ugly. Our young men sit wide-eyed, gleaning not just the lessons being offered but also the fathering they need. The women also offer a unique view of Godly femininity and intimacy with God that challenges and offers healing and invitation. Together, this broader TG community has donated over 15,000 hours of individual teaching and mentoring.

THE REMAINING 10%

We are excited about the ways we spend the balance of our time!

Destination Trips

Throughout the Fall and Spring, we lead and facilitate destination trips to the Outer Banks of North Carolina and to the shores of Sarasota, Florida. These trips take us to where men are located and offer an experience of what happens in our longer TG sessions. Men of all ages [including fathers and sons] receive solid teaching, hear men's stories and share adventures. Destination trips' locations are selected for some great fishing!

These trips continually lead young men to enroll in our 3 month sessions in Colorado!
